"What's in it for me when I study English?" by Olha Madylus

This presentation investigates the WIFM question for teenagers and young adults. 'What's in it for me?' they may well ask. What are the possible benefits for them in the process in learning English? Three main areas will be examined and practical learning/teaching strategies presented for all levels. We will consider the psychological and emotional need for direction and challenges in our lives as well as considering the role of success in motivation. We will look at the importance of goals and signposting success for example through exams. There has been a recent focus on developing life skills in the English language classroom. We will examine how developing skills such as critical thinking and creativity not only give students added value to their learning, but also help them to learn more English and recognize their progress. We shall also explore the advantages of collaborative learning and how different teacher roles can enhance the learning experience for all.



Olha Madylus has taught in the UK, Greece, Hong Kong and Venezuela. She is a freelance author, materials' designer, consultant and teacher trainer. She is based in London and does consultation, teacher training and teacher training for organisations such as The British Council and Ministries of Education worldwide.
